ike so many families, brothers Alfred and Edward Prosser signed up to serve in WWI. The sons of William and Louisa Workman of 7, Golden Grove, Newbridge signed up in 1915 less than 6 months apart. Edward was the elder and signed up first on the 17th of July 1915 and Alfred on the 4th December 1915.

One year later they died 2 months apart Edward was killed in action at Mametz Wood on the 26th July 1916 and Alfred died of wounds sustained whilst fighting on the Western Front on the 6th September 1916.
