Welcome to our Church at this special time.

Our Church of St Hilary is first documented in 1119, and the present building dates from the late-twelfth/early thirteenth century

The dedication to Saint Hilary, a fourth-century bishop of Poitiers, is rare in the British Isles. As a place-name St Hilary is known only in Cornwall and here in the Vale of Glamorgan.

The theme of our Flower Festival is the influence of Christianity on Art through two thousand years and how artists, sculptors, musicians and writers have interpreted this in their own times. The earliest painting displayed is *The Adoration of the Magi* (Capella Greca, Catacomb of Priscilla, Rome. c. 200), and the most recent sculpture is Mark Wallinger's *Ecce Homo*, installed on a plinth in Trafalgar Square during July 1999.

The flower arrangers have worked hard and with much imagination. We hope you enjoy your visit.

1 The Porch: The Nativity of Christ

2 South-west window: Sculpture

JACOB EPSTEIN Christ in Majesty, Llandaff Cathedral, 1957. MICHELANGELO Rondanini Pietà. Unfinished at the artist's death in 1564, this work was bequeathed by Michelangelo to a faithful servant and is now in the Castello Sforzesco, the city museum of Milan.

3 South Aisle - West window

This window depicts Saint Hilary (315-368) a bishop of Poitiers, France. Born at Poitiers of wealthy pagan parents, Hilary became an orator, married and had a daughter, Afra. In 350 he became a Christian; in 353 he was chosen bishop. For the rest of his life he was the outspoken champion of orthodoxy against the Arians.

The cope is displayed by kind permission of the Rector of our benefice, Robert Paterson.

4 South Aisle: Peace

Incorporated into this display is a Millennium Hymn, written by Gill Clay, a worshipper at this church. It was sung during the National Service at noon on New Year's Day 2000.

5 Tower entrance: Millennium bell

Until 1999 the tower contained five bells, four of which were originally cast by Abraham Rudhall of Gloucester in 1734. On 21 March 1999 the Archbishop of Wales dedicated a new treble bell inscribed TO THE GLORY OF GOD THE "SAINT HILARY 2000" COMMUNITY JUBILEE BELL. Earlier this year the Diocesan Association of Church Bell Ringers held their competition here and the St Hilary band of the Cowbridge benefice won the call change class.

- 6 North Aisle: Peace
- 7 Nave North-west window: Aspects of Art

Church windows have been used through the ages to illustrate Bible and other stories. The stained-glass here depicts angels worshipping, and Christ carrying the Cross of Calvary. It was erected in memory of the Revd. George Traherne MA, vicar of St Hilary (d. 1853)

8 Font: The Baptism of Christ

The medieval font is made from a block of local Sutton stone. The illustration on the wall is from the dome mosaic of Theodoric's Arian Baptistry, Ravenna, 493-526. It depicts the River Jordan on the left, John the Baptist on the right and Christ standing naked up to his waist in water. The Holy Spirit pours down from a dove above Christ's head.

12 Altar and Reredos

LEONARDO DA VINCI The Last Supper painted in the refectory of the Dominican convent, Milan, c. 1495-8.

In 1576, it was decreed by Elizabeth I that all parishes should be provided with a Communion cup. On display is our Elizabethan chalice and paten dating from 1577. The reredos behind the altar is made of various pieces of polished marble, inlaid with minor decorative motifs. The centre panel is a representation of the Last Supper after Leonardo da Vinci.
