HAVE A HEART ON VALENTINE'S DAY

The St Hilary bakers took over the phone box mid-February to raise funds for new paediatric pads for the defibrillator located outside the village hall. St Hilary Valentine Bakes were available at the phone box with delicious items such as Persian Love Cakes, iced heart biscuits, millionaires'





jammy dodgers, chocolate chip cookies (GF) and many more. All bakes were wrapped for self-service or available for delivery to those shielding at home.

The sale raised in excess of £350 which massively exceeded the amount needed for the new pads.

The remainder has been earmarked for future maintenance of the defibrillator and including some new/ top-up training once allowed.

A contribution to ongoing telephone box maintenance was made.

DR WHO BBC DONATION DECISION

Following the filming which took place in January, the BBC has made a donation of £1,500 to the village. Ideas for who the money should be spent were sought from villagers and 20 ideas were put forward by over 40 villagers. An assessment group of 13 villagers was set up to consider how the money should be spent. After further consultation, the ideas were narrowed down to 6 ideas to consider in more detail. The group has come to a conclusion that 3 ideas should be funded:

- planting of bulbs around St Hilary
- purchase of a marquee for the village
- the installation of a picnic table or bench

Among other ideas which are being followed up (without funding from the Dr Who donation) is a village event involving and benefiting many villagers, especially children, and raising spirits after lockdown is eased. There are funds available from Winter's Eve 2020 for entertainment that can be put towards the event – these funds are earmarked for a musical spectacular and a harp recital.

MARY'S ST DAVID'S DAY BAKEATHON

Mary Llewellyn made over 800 Welsh cakes to raise money for Marie Curie on St David's Day. Mary's life was taken over by baking dozens of cakes after she asked if anybody would be interested in Welsh cakes for charity via the St Hilary WhatsApp group. What started as about six dozen ended up at more than 70 dozen — 840!

Mary sold her Welsh cakes at £3 for half a dozen, and £5 for a full dozen, but said that many people had kindly paid extra. "People have been so generous. We've raised about £500," said Mary. "It's so kind, because Marie Curie is such a good cause. Obviously with the pandemic, all charities are suffering and we still need them. It's a little way of helping them to carry on their good work."



A big thank you to Waitrose for their contribution to the fundraiser by paying for the ingredients. The money raised for Marie Curie will go towards support for people living with a terminal illness and their families. Mary and her family have a sad connection with Marie Curie who

supported them when Lindsey passed away. "Sadly, I lost my husband two years ago, and we'd just made contact with Marie Curie. Life would be a great deal harder for so many people if they didn't have the support of Marie Curie, and other charities like Macmillan and Velindre," she said.



The charity Welsh cakes have been delivered throughout last week via a very unusual delivery service – pony express! Four of Mary's grandchildren have ponies and they were out in force after school delivering the delicious treats to villagers. Mary said "On Friday the standing joke was 'how many people

does it take to deliver Welsh cakes? Six people, two ponies and a car!"

Normally Ewa Thomas carries out a door-to-door collection for Marie Curie, however that was not permitted this year.
