

RECENT EVENTS

ST HILARY WI

St Hilary WI met on September 10th at a special meeting, hosting visitors from Pendoylan WI. Speaker Eurwen Richards gave a talk 'All About Cheese', a subject on which she is eminently qualified to speak. Apart from many other accolades, Eurwen has received an award at the World Cheese Awards, where she has been a judge for the past 25 years. Eurwen's talk on the history of cheese and her own experiences with the making of different kinds of cheese was interesting and entertaining.



The WI tree planting was to commemorate the Centenary of the Women's Institute (1915-2015). In 2015 we planted an Acer but sadly it didn't survive last winter, so we have taken advice from Ewart

Schofield, and planted a Rowan tree, which is ideally suited to the area. Our President, Betty Thomas, assisted Ewart with the planting and Molly Ranger (Vice President) placed the commemorative slate sign at the base of the Rowan tree.

THE BADEN POWELL WOMEN

The opening night of the Festival took place at Coed Hills with two films directed by Hywel George titled "Baden Powell Women – the legacy of St Clair." The first film focussed on Gill Clay, grand-daughter of Baden Powell, her life and commitment to the scouting movement.

Gill's enthusiasm for the power of Scouting and Guiding in developing young people was evident to see as was the respect and love she receives from those she meets across the worldwide family. The second film focussed on Gill's daughter Daf and her struggle with, what at times had been a burden, the legacy of being a Baden-Powell woman. Daf and her husband travelled to Kenya to investigate her past and in doing so started a journey to assist young women find themselves and their potential.



MAKING MUSIC FOR SILENT MOVIES

The Making Music for Silent Movies Workshop was a wonderful affair. For 90 mins children, between the ages of 6 and 13, explored a wide range of percussion instruments whilst creating sounds to accompany a Buster Keaton movie 'One Week'. Expert tuition from Luke and Iolo,




