• "The Knapton family lived in two of the three cottages behind the Town Hall. They had two cottages because they were a sizeable family and one of the daughters was a seamstress and taught dressmaking. She always had up to six learners, and so occupied one cottage herself. Son Fred was very well known in the town. He was a monumental mason and made all the local gravestones. He worked in the yard on the Bridge. There were other boys I knew. Syd worked for Evans the Draper in the shop, and I think Willie was a teacher".
