This is the last Will and Testament of me David
Dorods of the Town of Corobidge in the County of Glamorgan Sheriff
made the eighteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty
five I give and devise all that freehold dwelling house wherewith I now
reside with the garden ^{adjoining} thereto and other appurtenances unto my dear
wife Mary Dorods for the term of her natural life and after her
decease I give and devise the same unto and between my two sons
Richard and David Dorods their heirs and assigns for ever as to
tenants in common and not as joint tenants I give and devise the
freehold dwelling houses and stable with the appurtenances held by me

under the Corporation of Cambridge unto my brother Jonathan Doreels and
my friend Elias Dapport of Saurnal Orage Courtman in trust for the use
and benefit of my said two sons equally for the remainder of the term for
redemtion & sold the same & give and bequeath all my household furniture to be
equally divided between my said wife and two sons & give and bequeath
the sum of one hundred pounds to my said wife for her own use and benefit
absolutely & give and bequeath the sum of forty pounds to my friends the
said Elias ^{and} Edward Chamas & Apocrony in that County Director of the
said ^{and} my will is that the same be laid out by them at interest and
the interest paid by them annually paid for the redemption of the ransom of
religion in the new built Chapel at the Corer of Cambridge aforesaid & give &
bequeath my stock in trade cattle and all the residue of my personal estate
redemtion into the said Jonathan Doreels and Elias Dapport and the
survivor of them his executors and administrators in trust nevertheless to
purchase and absolutely dispose of the said personal estate and convert the
same into ready money and sell in the best manner that may be due to us at
my decease and after payment of my just debts funeral and testamentary
my will is that the surplus be laid out by them at interest on a
good real or personal security and that so much of the interest thereof as
shall be necessary together with the profits of the said household premises to
be laid out in the maintenance and education of my said two sons until
they respectively attain their age of twenty one years at which period it is
my will that each of them shall be entitled to a moiety of the principal
money together with the surplus of interest if any and my will is that
my said Executors may appropriate such sum of money as they may judge
my said two sons or either of them in
the way of business before they attain their age as aforesaid and my will is
that my said Executors shall not be answerable for more monies than they
actually receive nor for any loss incurred in the trust monies without
their wilful neglect and that one shall not be answerable for the other
but each of them for his own acts only and I do hereby nominate and
appoint the said Jonathan Doreels and Elias Dapport joint Executors of
this my last will and Testament in trust nevertheless for the purposes
aforesaid in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
day and year first above written. J. Doreels. Signed sealed published
and declared by the said David Doreels as and for his last will & Testament
in the presence of us who in his presence at his request and in the
presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses
James Reynolds Senr. Cambridge Keeper of the House of Correction. James Reynolds

Proved at London 7th. Janry 1826 before the Judge by the oaths of Jonathan
Doreels in the will written Doreels the brother & Elizabeth Dapport the sister
to whom adition was granted having been first sworn by Oathen duly to advise
