The will of Rice Thomas of Cowbridge, dated 23rd., April 1700.

To his wife Ann Thomas, all his houses with their appurtenances in Cowbridge for the term of her life and then the house purchased from Peter Hugh outside the west gate of Cowbridge to his son Robert Rice as freehold. The house held under a chattle lease to Robert, but for want of issue to grandson Rice Morgan, the son of William Morgan of Penlline.

All the rest to his wife Ann Thomas as executrix.

In the Name of God Amen I Rine Thomas of Cambridge in the County of  
 Glamorgan & Diocese of Landaff, being sick in body but of good  
 and perfect Remembrance of mind & of good, do make this my last  
 writing to be my last will & testament. First I commend my soule  
 into the hands of God, hoping through the mercy & the Meritte of Iesus  
 Christ my Redeemer to be saved, & giving my body to the Church  
 of God to be buried with my wife Anne Thomas all my houses  
 with their appurtenances in Cambridge aforesaid for the term of her  
 life. and after her decease. I give devise and bequeath on house  
 with its appurtenances that I purchased from Peter Hughelymy  
 without the west gate of Cambridge aforesaid with all usutings  
 touching the same. after my wifes decease to be freehold unto  
 my son Richard Rine husband and appurtenances I give & bequeath  
 unto my son Robert Rine my dwelling house with its appurtenances  
 I hold from the town of Cambridge by the name of the house  
 of the house. during the term of the house. and to the issue of the body  
 lawfully begotten. and for want thereof of the house of the house  
 of the house. after the decease of the said Robert Rine  
 remaining (unto my grandchild Rine Morgan the son of William  
 Morgan of the parish of yewell in the said County for the term  
 not expired thereof. the rest of my good cattles & chattels  
 not herein bequeathed. I bequeath unto my wife Anne Thomas  
 whom I have and appoint sole executrix of this my last will  
 and testament. witness my hand and seal the third and last  
 day of April in the twelfth year of the reign of our said  
 Lord King William the third of England &c. Anno dmi. 1700
