

The will of Joan Jones, also Miles, of Cowbridge, widow, dated 6th., August 1724.

To the poor of Cowbridge, 20s.

To her daughter, Joan Jones, 1s.

To her dear Lewis Jones £5.

To her dear Ann Miles £5.

To her godchild Elizabeth Powell, one guinea.

To her niece Susanna Powell, a guinea to buy a ring.

To her nephew Edward Williams, a guinea.

To her daughter Mary, the customaryhold land occupied by Maud Evans.

To her daughter Mary, the freehold house lately purchased from Edward Morgan.

To the Rev. Robert Powell, one broad piece.

To her cousin Taylor, one broad piece.

To her nephew Evan Williams, one broad piece.

All her goods and chattels to her daughter Mary Jones.

Robert Powell, John Taylor and Evan Williams to be guardians until Mary reaches the age of 21.

60 – 62 Eastgate, the Three Tuns 1725. Possibly the Joan Williams of 1652/3, daughter of William Miles. She named 'dear' Lewis Jones, also 'dear' Ann Miles. Goddaughter Elizabeth Powell, niece Susannah Powell, nephew Edward Williams, nephew Evan Williams. Daughter Mary had (1) the 4 acres of customaryhold land lately purchased from Maud Evans and (2) the house lately purchased from Edward Morgan. Reference also to her cousin Taylor. She also held the property next door, Hill House (54 Eastgate). In 1717 the house was acquired by Joan Jones from Edward Morgan, purchased by her in 1722. Left in her will to her daughter Mary Jones (who married Edmund Kemeys – *Trecastle deeds 46-57*)
