She also held the property next door, Hill House (54 Eastgate). In 1717 the house was acquired by Joan Jones from Edward Morgan, purchased by her in 1722. Left in her will to her daughter Mary Jones (who married Edmund Kemeys – *Trecastle deeds 46-57*)
