

The will of Richard Lloyd, yeoman, of Llanblethian, dated 1st., August 1710.

His dwelling house and seven acres in Llanblethian to his nephew, Richard Lloyd the son of the late Thomas Lloyd ^{late rector} of St. Brides Major, and his heirs. In default of such heirs the property should pass to Richard's brother, John Lloyd and likewise to their sister Barbara. Should either brother occupy the property then they were to pay Barbara £30 within 3 years of his death.

To his niece Mary Lloyd of Cowbridge a guinea to be paid within a month of his death.

His house in Cowbridge near the white well to John Lloyd.

To his friend Howell Evan of St. Mary Hill, a guinea in remembrance of him, to be paid a month after death.

To his journeyman, Thomas Hopkin of Cowbridge 5s. to be paid immediately after death.

To his journeyman Rees Tully, the best colt.

To the poor of Cowbridge 20s. to be distributed amongst them a month after his death.

To his servant Ann David the cupboard and coffer in the buttery, also his wife's clothes, woollens, linen and the mantle with the silver clasp and a golden signet. She was also to receive the feather bed and bedstead with all appurtenances, a square table, two joint stools in the kitchen, a wooden chair, the second best brass pot, a middling brass cauldron, a little brass skillett and two pewter platters from the cupboard in the kitchen. Also £10 to be paid within a month of his death, should she be prevented from receiving the property then the executors must pay her a further £10.

Rest of the property to his nephews David Williams, Rector of the parish of Llanmihangel and John Lloyd as executors. They are to lay either a blue marble stone or a Bridgend free stone of about thirty or forty shillings on his grave.
