

*Crossways*

The will of Edward Deere of Llanblethian, gentleman, dated 20th., January 1726.

All property in the parish of Llanblethian to his son, Edward Deere, subject to the payment £300 each to daughters, Ann Miles and Frances Deere within a year of death. The £300 to Ann was subject to her husband settling lands to the value of £30 a year upon her and her heirs.

His son Edward Deere to be executor.

Signed by Edward Deere.

Witnessed by Richard Lloyd, Richard Lewis, Griffith Owen.

Proved 8th., May 1727.

In the Name of God Amen I Edward  
Deere of Crossways in the Parish of Llanblethian  
in the County of Glamorgan Gentleman Do make  
and Ordain my last Will and Testament in manner  
and Form following Imprimis I give Devise and  
Bequeath unto my loving Son Edward Deere all  
my Possessions Lands Tenements and Hereditaments  
whatsoever Situate Lying and being in the said  
Parish of Llanblethian and County aforesaid in  
South Wales whether Freehold Copyhold or Customary  
hold on condition nevertheless and Subject to the  
Payment of three hundred pounds to my Daughter  
Ann Miles and the sum of three hundred pounds  
to my Daughter Frances Deere within twelve  
months after my Disease as to the three hundred  
pounds that I have hereby Bequeathed to my  
Daughter Ann Miles my meaning is that my  
Son in Law Mr Miles her Husband before payment  
of y<sup>e</sup> said sum shall settle upon my said Daughter  
Lands to the yearly value of thirty pounds during  
her life and after her Disease to her next Heirs  
upon Forfeiture of the said Legacy to my Executor  
Lastly I Nominate my said son Edward Deere  
Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament  
Revoking all other Wills In witness whereof I  
have hereunto set my hand seal this Twentieth Day of  
January In the year of our Lord one Thousand seven  
hundred and Twenty Six.
