

The will of Maud Grant, widow, of Llanblethian, dated 3rd., March 1731.

To her son John George the best bed and bed clothes.

To her daughter in law Joan George 1s. to be paid within a year of death.

To her grandson John George 1s. to be paid within a year of death.

To her daughter Catherine Grant 1s. to be paid within a year of death.

To her grandson Lewis Grant 2 ewes and a ewe and a lamb.

The rest of her goods to her daughter Alice George as executrix.

The mark of Maud Grant.

The will was proved 14th., June 1739 naming Catherine Grant, Alice George having died.

of lawful British money to be paid to him within one year
after my decease by my Executors John George and bequeath
unto my well beloved daughter Catherine Grant the
summe of one shilling to be paid to her within one year
after my decease by my Executors John George and
bequeath unto my grandson Lewis Grant two years or
a year and a half of my life after my decease to be
given him by my Executors hereafter named I do
will all the rest of my goods chattels and Cattle moveables and
immovables not before given and bequeathed I do hereby
give devise and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter
Anne George whom I do hereby nominate and appoint
to be my sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament
writing and signing all other wills and Testaments by me
heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seale the third day of March in the fourth
year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the second of
Great Britain King and Queen Anne in the year of our Lord
