The bond, dated 20th November 1756, names Mary Richard, his widow, David Jones of St. Hilary, gentleman and Morgan David of St. Hilary, yeoman and a bond of £200.



Know all Men by these presents that we Mary Richard of Llanthorn within the parish of Llanthorn, in the County of Glamorgan widow, David Jones of the parish of Saint Hilary in the County of Glamorgan Gentleman, and Morgan David of the said parish of Saint Hilary, in the County of Glamorgan Gentleman we become bound unto the right Reverend Father in God Bishop of Landaff, in a Sum of £1000 pounds of good and lawful money of Great Britain to be paid unto the said Bishop or his lawful attorney, His Ex^{ty}s. Councils or Assignes for the good and faithful payment thereof, truly to be made and well observed, each of us severally and jointly, and our heirs and assigns, firmly by these presents sealed with our seals, the 26th Day of November, in the Year of our Lord Christ 1756.

The Condition of this Obligation is such, that if the above bounden Mary Richard widow the Heir and Administratrix of all and singular the goods and chattels and credits of the said Richard late of Llanthorn within the parish of Llanthorn, in the County of Glamorgan and Diocese of Landaff deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all, singular Goods, Stocks, Credits of what kind so ever shall come to the hand possession or knowledge of the said Mary Richard or into the hand possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Landaff at or before the Twentieth Day of March next ensuing and the same Goods Stocks and Credits and all other the said Goods Stocks and Credits of the said deceased which at the time of his death or which at any time after shall come to the hand and possession of the said Mary Richard or into the hand or possession of any other person or persons for her, do well and truly administer according to Law, and further do make or cause to be made a true and just account of her said Administration at or before the Twentieth Day of November which will be in the Year 1757 and all the rest and residue of the said Goods Stocks and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration Account the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto each person or persons respectively as the said Judge by his Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Statute and Memorials of an Act of Parliament intituled an Act for the better settling of Intestate Estates shall think and appoint, and if hereafter it shall appear any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the said or he therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court making request to have it approved of accordingly if the said Mary Richard or he being therein lawfully required do so do and do give the said Letters of Administration upon the said Testament being first read and made into the said Court, then this Obligation to be void and of no effect and to remain in full force and virtue.
