To her son in law Howell Lewis of Aberthin all her goods as executor.

Codicil - to David Sweeting son of Richard Sweeting 10s.6d. To Anne Sweeting, daughter of Robert Sweeting 10 shillings and a crown each to the women who would lay out her corpse.

Proved 14th., June 1757, the assets not amounting to more then £20. (Crossed out).
