

The will of Jennet Howell, widow, of Llanblethian dated 12th February 1760.

To her sister, Mary David, spinster, of Llanwonno, ten shillings a year for the rest of her life.

The rest of the money due from her nephew Richard Howell of Ystradowen to pay for goods delivered to him to be given to her executors.

The rest of her property to her nephew, Evan David of Ystradowen and her niece Margaret David, spinster of Cowbridge, as joint executors.

Almighty god, do make and ordains this my Last
Will and Testament, in manner and form
following, that is to say, first and Principally I commit
my soul into the hands of Almighty god, hoping
through the merits death and Passion of my Saviour
Jesus Christ, to have full and free pardon and forgive-
ment of all my sins, and to inherit everlasting Life and
my Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried
at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
and as touching the disposition of all such temporal
estate, as it hath Pleas'd Almighty God to bestow
upon me, I give and dispose thereof as followeth

Of first I will that my debts and sundry Charges shall
be payd and discharged

Also I give and bequeath unto my sister Mary
David of the parish of Llanermor, ten
shillings a year during her Life-time to be payd
by my Executors hereinafter named

Also I give and bequeath the Remainder of the
Money due unto me from my Nephew Richard
Stodd of the parish of Ystradowen, as by Bill
of Sale son gods & delivered unto him unto my
Executors hereinafter named

All the Rest and Residue of my Personall
Estate goods and Chattels whatsoever, I doe give
and bequeath unto my Nephew Evan David of
the parish of ystradowen, and my Niece Margett
David of the Town of Cowbridge spinster, Joyntly,
full and sole Executors of this my Last Will
and Testament

And I doe hereby Revok and make void
all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore
made, In witness whereof I the said Jonnett
Hood to this my Last Will and Testament, being
contained in two sides of one halfe sheet of
Paper set my hand and seal the Twelfth
daye of February in the year of our Lord
God seven teen Hundred and Sixty
