It also describes Edward David as being a widower and Catherine Howell , the executrix, as being his daughter and wife of Thomas Howell. The bond is set at £300.



we became bound unto the Right Rev. & Grand Father in God Bishop by divine permission Lord Bishop of London  
in the sum of three hundred & - pounds of good and lawful money of great Britain to be paid unto the said  
Lord Bishop or his lawfull attorney his L. & Adm. Surgers or Apothecaries for the good and full payment of  
him well and truly to be made we bind ourselves each of us distinctly severally for the whole sum to the said  
Adm. firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and Dated the 12<sup>th</sup> Day of December in the  
Year of our Lord Christ, 1760.

The Testament of this obligation is such that if Catherine Howell wife of the above  
bore son Thomas Howell the natural and lawfull Daughter and administrator  
of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits of Edward David late of the  
parish of Llanblethian, in the County of Glamorgan and Diocese of  
Llandaff widower deceased .. . . . .

do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the good Chattels and benefits of the said deceased w<sup>m</sup> which have or shall come to the hands physical or knowledge of the said Testator either heretofore or now or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her and the same does exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Commissioners Court of Probate at the time and place

Day of March .. . most Enquiring And then same Goods Chattels and Credits and also  
the above Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which at the time of her Death or which at any time after  
shall come to the hands and possession of the said Catherine Howell .. . I wish the  
hands and possession of any other person or persons for her to do well and truly administered  
to allow her further dominion or cause to be made a true and accept of her said Administratrix  
at or before the twelfth Day of December which will be in the year 1769  
and all the rest and residue of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall be funds remaining upon  
the said Administratrix - Accept the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge of  
said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the  
said Judge by his Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true intent Meaning of an Act of Parliament  
intituled an Act for the better settling of Debtor's Estates shall direct and appoint and if therefor it  
shall appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and taken or left  
therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court making request to have it proved  
accordingly if the said Catherine Howell .. . being deceased lawfully  
Required to render and deliver the said Letters of Administration upon her Estate  
being first had and made out the said Court. Then this Bond shall be void and of no force
