

The will of Elizabeth William of Llanblethian, widow, dated 16th., January 1761.

All debts and funeral expenses to be discharged.

To her daughter Mary Williams, £30.

The rest of her goods to her son Edward Evan as executor.

To be buried in Landough Churchyard.

The mark of Elizabeth William.

Witnessed by Elizabeth Ballard, David Jenkin, Howell Lewis.

Proved 15th., April 1762.

In the Name of god Amen I Elizabeth William of the
parish of Llanblethian in the County of Glamorgan widow
being in good health of body and of good and perfect mind
and memory, Ieuse & therefore given to Almighty god I do
make and ordaine this my present Last will and testament
in manner and forme following that is to say First and principally
I command my soul into the hands of Almighty god having
through the wrytts death & passion of my saviour jesus Christ
to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins
and to inherit everlasting life and my body I commit to the
earth, to be decently buried att the discretion of my Executor
hereafter named, and as Touching the disposition of all such
my personal estate as it hath pleased Almighty god to bestow upon
me give and dispose thereof as followeth

First I will that my debts and funeral charges shall be payed
and discharged —

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary William
the sum of thirty pounds so to payed her by my Executor
hereafter named —

All the rest and residue of my personal estate goods and
chattels wherover I do give and bequeath unto my loving
son Edward Evans full and sole Executor of this my Last will
and testament —

and I desire that my body may be buried in Landough church-
yard, and I do hereby Revise disannul and make void all former
wills and testaments by me before made — In witness whereof I the said Elizabeth William to this my Last will and
testament being contained in one side of halfe a sheet of paper set
my hand and seal the sixteenth day of January Seventy nine
and sixty one —
