

The will of David Sweeting of Aberthin, Llanblethian, yeoman, dated 1st., March 1767.

To his wife Sarah Sweeting and her customary heirs, a customaryhold messuage, stable and garden together with two parcels of customaryhold land in Aberthin, in the manor of Llanblethian, mortgaged to William Bowen of Llantwit Major, yeoman, for the sum of £50 plus interest and surrendered in the manor court for such use.
The rest of his goods to his wife Sarah as executrix.

In the name of God, Amen: I David Sweeting -
of Aburthin in the parish of Laublethian in the
County of Glamorgane yeoman being sick in body -
but of sound and perfect mind memory and -
understanding praised be God, Do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner and
form following, That is to say, I Give and Devise
unto my beloved wife Sarah Sweeting all that
Customary hold mesuage Stable and garden -
~~house~~ ~~belonging~~ ~~together~~ also with two
parcels of Customary hold Lands situate lying
and being at Aburthin aforesaid and within
the manor of Laublethian in the said County
the same being now in mortgage to William -
Bowen of the parish of Lan-twit major in the said
County yeoman to secure the Repayment of
fifty pounds and Interest and are already -
surrendered in the Court of the said manor to
~~such uses as I shall by my will declare~~ To
Have and To Hold the same unto my said
wife Sarah Sweeting and her Customary -
Heirs for ever, I also Give and Bequeath
unto my said wife Sarah Sweeting all and singular
the Rest and Residue of my Goods Chattels and personal
Estate and I do hereby nominate constitute and
appoint my said wife Sarah whole and sole executrix
of this my will revoking all former ^{by me} wills ^{and} Testaments
that to be my last will and Testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
first Day of March in the year of our Lord
Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Seven.
