Glamorgan Widow being Sick in Body but of Sound and perfect mind Memory
and Understanding Thanks be to Almighty God do hereby make and Ordain
this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say)
I Give and Bequeath all and singular my Goods, Chattels, Leases Bonds, Notes
Ready money and all other my Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever unto
George Richard of Newton in the parish of Lantibethan aforesaid Yeoman whom
I do hereby Nominate Constitute and Appoint whole and sole Executor of
this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my Hand and Seal the fifteenth Day of October in the Year of our Lord One
Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Nine.
