and Adm^{rs} firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and Dated the 20th day
of September, in the year of our Lord Christ 1750.

The condition of this obligation is such, that if the above bounden
Anne John widow, the Relict and Administratrix of all and singular the
goods, Chattels and Credits of Jenkin John late of the parish of Colwinstone
aforesaid, in the County of Glamorgan and Diocese of Landaff deceased.

do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular
Goods Chattels & Credits of the said Deceased, have or shall come to the Hands
possession or knowledge of the said Anne John
or into the Hands possession of any other person or persons for her and the
same to made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the
Consistory Court of Landaff at or before the first day of December next ensuing
and the same Goods Chattels & Credits of the said Deceased, at the time of
her Death, or which at any Time after shall come to the Hands possession
of the said Anne John or into the Hands

possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly
administer according to Law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true
and Just Account of her said Administration, at or before the first day
Day of September which will be in the year 1751 and all the Rest and Residue
