In the name of God Amen the thirtieth day of August  
 1671 I Edward Bamag<sup>r</sup> of Boston within the parish of Llangan  
 in the county of Glamorgan, and within the Diocese of  
 Landaff, being sick in body but of good and  
 (promised by Almighty God) doo make and doo fort knowen  
 my last will and Testament in manner and ordaine this  
 first I commend my soule into the hand of Almighty God  
 my Crutch hoping assuredly through the only merits of Iesus  
 christ my Redeemer to receive remission of my sinnes and  
 everlasting life, and my body to be buried in christian  
 buriall; Then I give and bequeath unto the good of the  
 said parish of Llangan tenne shillings to be paid by my  
 exorsors hereafter named within sixe monthes after my  
 decease, I doo I give and bequeath unto my servant Thomas  
 Jeffrey ffor shillings to be paid him, tenne shillings  
 yearly for foure yeares, <sup>being due</sup> ~~that is due~~ from John Lloyd of  
 Cowbridge Baker, I doo I give and bequeath unto Joan Bamag<sup>r</sup>  
 the daughter of my uncle Morgan Bamag<sup>r</sup> five pound  
 sterling, to be paid her in manner and forme as hereafter  
 shall be expressed and declared, I doo give devise and  
 bequeath, all that messuages wherem I live and all  
 outhouses barnyards and gardenes therunto belonging  
 together with all that tenement of land that I was in  
 and inherite from my uncle John Stradling <sup>unto my wife</sup> ~~with~~  
 by and during the <sup>whole</sup> ~~term~~ of her natural life together  
 with all my goodes Cattel, and Chatty whatsover <sup>to goe</sup> ~~upon~~  
 condition that she shall well and truly discharge and paye  
 my debty and Legary with my funerall expences,  
 provided always and my will is that if my said  
 wife, will not willingly undergoe the payment of my  
 debty Legary and funerall expences, aforesaid

That then my will is and I doe hereby give devise and  
bequeath all the Tenements aforesaid with the appurtenances  
unto my well beloved friends, <sup>Christen</sup> Edward Camague of  
Newcastle esq Edward Camague of Wythburne Clerk  
and Watkin Lewis of Newcastle aforesaid joint, as-  
surors in trust, together with all my <sup>goodly</sup> Cattle and Chattels  
aforesaid / To hold the said ~~land~~ Messuages lands and  
Tenements aforesaid, <sup>until</sup> my said debts legacies and  
funerall expences, be fully satisfied paid and  
discharged, provided that my wife shall have ~~received~~  
therefrom an annuity of Ten pound yearly toward her  
maintenance the same be paid her yearly, And after  
the payment of my said debts legacies and funerall  
expences; my will is and I doe hereby give devise  
and bequeath, all the Messuages lands and  
Tenements aforesaid unto Watkin Lewis the sonne of  
my Cousin Watkin Lewis of Newcastle aforesaid, To  
hold the same unto him and his heirs and assignes  
for ever, upon Condition that hee shall satisfy and  
pay unto William Lewis & Edward Lewis two other  
<sup>of the</sup> ~~children~~ of the said Watkin Lewis the sume of six score  
pound sterling; <sup>equally</sup> between them; at such time  
as they the said, William and Edward shall accomplish  
the age of one and twenty years; if the said Watkin  
Lewis be then in actual possession of the said Tenements  
and if not my will is that hee pay the same <sup>in</sup> three  
years after hee shall come into actual possession  
thereof, provided also that in case of default



of payment at the time or times aforesaid, my will is  
and I do hereby give and devise the premises aforesaid  
unto the said William Lewis and Edward Lewis equally  
between them, and their heirs & assigns for ever, or  
to the survivors of them; provided also that if either  
of the said William, or Edward, shall happen to die and  
unfray before they receive the said six score pounds  
my will is that the executor or executors of the testator shall  
pay unto the survivors; provided likewise and my will  
is that my said wife shall have an annuity of twenty  
pounds, starting from the premises during her life to be  
paid her in manner aforesaid; And my will is that  
if my said wife take upon <sup>her</sup> the Administration of my  
goods, that after she pay my debts aforesaid that  
she pay the five pounds herein before bequeathed  
unto the said Jan Gamage the daughter of the said Margar  
Gamage; and if the same come into the hands  
of the said Trustees my will is that they pay the  
same accordingly, provided also and my will is  
that if in case my said wife take upon her the  
Administration <sup>of my goods</sup>, and that she die in the interim before  
my debts, legacies and funeral expenses be fully  
satisfied and paid, My will is that the said Trustees  
shall hold the premises aforesaid until such time  
as the same be fully satisfied, discharged, and paid,  
And I do hereby nominate and appoint my said  
wife executrix of this my said will & Testament

upon the Chief & ordinary of our university In a  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
