TASK FOR WOMAN MAYOR

Traffic along the main road was stopped, a bugler from St. Athan sounded a fanfare and the Mayor, Mrs. F. G. Hinton,

read the Proclamation.

The Rev. Lewis led prayers for the new Queen and the National Anthem was sung.

Mayor and officials then walked in procession to the site of the old cross, where the Proclamation was repeated, and then to the south gate outside the grammar school, where it was read again.

A special journey was then made to Pontfaen School so that the children there could

hear it read.
