Ho late in possession of Evan Lewis and now of Edward Bates, surgeon, on W, and

Great house late in possession of Mrs Jane Carne, spinster, and now of Cecil Thomas, widow on E

And same pses were purchased by James Morgan, late of C, mercer, from said Frances Richards, then late of Cowbridge but afterwards of Llanblethian, widow, and were by said James Morgan devised to the said Henry Morgan whose heirs conveyed it to Evan Jones and Henry Llewellin.
