For a house 6 years old £8.8s

Received 3 dozen of candles from Thomas Thomas of Cowbridge £1.8s.6d

1799 Paid Mr Verity at his house in Cowbridge for materials

November: for 2 pair of breeches £1.11s.2d

December: paid Bird of Cowbridge for a ? lanthorn (poor writing) 3 shillings

Paid for cakes & muffins ate at Cowbridge 3s 2d.

1802 (Brother John at Llanblethian)

1804, April 20<sup>th</sup> I attended the meeting this day on the Property Tax at the Pelican in Cowbridge and also met Mr Traherne and appointed the overseers of the poor at the Horse and Jockey.

Brother John at Cowbridge. Brother William at Cowbridge.

1805, 15<sup>th</sup> November Spent the night at Llanblethian at Mr Morgan's and my brother Edward's and walked up with Mrs N to Cowbridge to see the illuminations after Nelson's victory.
