# AT THE TOWN HALL COWBRIDGE

#### Proceedings and Order of Ceremony

- 11.00 a.m. Her Worship the Mayor, Consort, Aldermen, Councillors, Officials and Guests will meet at the Church of the Holy Cross.
- 11.10 a.m. Her Worship the Mayor will greet Colonel Sir Cennydd Traherne and they will inspect the Guard of Honour provided by the 'C' (Glamorgan Yeomanry) Troop, Royal Artillery, (T.A.V.R.,) (Volunteer), and the Royal Air Force, St. Athan, before proceeding into Church for a Service of Dedication by the Mayor's Chaplain, The Reverend S. H. Mogford M.A., R.D.
- 11.35 a.m. Procession, led by the Corps of Drums of the 3rd. Volunteer Battalion, The Royal Regiment of Wales, will move to the Town Hall where Aldermen, Councillors, Officials and Guests will take their places.
- 12 noon Her Worship the Mayor, Consort, Sir Cennydd and Lady Traherne will take their places and the Mayor will call upon the Town Clerk to read the Minutes convening the Meeting.

The Town Clerk will then read the Resolution passed by the Borough Council at a Meeting duly convened and held on the 9th February 1971, when it was Resolved:

"That COLONEL SIR CENNYDD TRAHERNE, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Doctor of Laws, Her Majesty's Lieutenant for the County of Glamorgan, being a person who has rendered eminent services to the Borough within the meaning of Section 259 of the Local Government Act, 1933, be admitted an Honorary Freeman of the Borough of Cowbridge."

Her Worship the Mayor will call upon Alderman Glyn McNeil to propose the Presentation of the Freedom of the Borough to COLONEL SIR CENNYDD TRAHERNE, K.G., T.D., LL.D., and Councillor J. A. Phillips to second the proposal.

Her Worship the Mayor will then put the resolution to the Borough Council.

COLONEL SIR CENNYDD TRAHERNE will be sworn by the Town Clerk as a Freeman of the Borough as follows:

"I swear to be true to our Sovereign Lady the Queen and the Lord of this Town and Borough, I shall be obedient to the Mayor of this Borough for the time being and obey his Warrants, Precepts and Commands; I will be civil and obedient to the Aldermen of the same and also I shall, as much as in my power lies, contribute and do every act and thing for the good government and safety of the Borough and the inhabitants thereof.

So help me God"

Her Worship the Mayor will ask COLONEL SIR CENNYDD TRAHERNE to sign the Roll recording his admission, and on behalf of the Borough, will present to SIR CENNYDD a casket containing the Illuminated Scroll of his admission to the Honorary Freedom of the Borough.

The Mayor's daughter will present a bouquet to Lady Traherne.

Colonel Sir Cennydd Traherne will respond.

Her Worship the Mayor will declare the Meeting Closed.
