The King to all to whom ye Greeting Whereof our Town of  
Conbridge in our County of Glamorgan is very Antient and populous  
and the Burgesses and Inhabitants of the same Town by divers and  
several names the time whereof the Memory of Man is Not to the  
contrary divers Liberties customs Franchis. immunities and  
prehemineces have had used and enjoyed as well by reason and  
means of divers Charters and Letters patent by divers of our Progenitors  
Ancestors and Predecessors heretofore Kings and Queens of England  
and by divers Lords and Ladies of Glamorgan to em heretofore made  
granted and confirmed as by reason and means of divers  
prescriptions uses and customs in the same Town heretofore used  
and accustomed AND WHEREAS our beloved Subjects the Bailiffs  
Aldermen and Burgesses of our Town of Conbridge aforesaid have  
humbly besought us that We for the better rule and Government of  
the same Town we would vouchsafe to extend to reach to them our  
Royal Grace and favour in this behalf ALL that we for the better  
Rule and Government of the same Town the said Bailiffs Aldermen  
and Burgesses of the Town aforesaid by whatsoever name or names  
they are now incorporated or heretofore were incorporated into one  
body Corporate and Politick by the name of Bailiffs Aldermen  
and Burgesses of the Town of Conbridge in the County of Glamorgan  
we do make Ordain reduce and create a new with the addition of  
certain Libertys as to us should seem best We therefore Willing  
that for ever hereafter there may be continually had in the same  
Town one certain and indubitable form of and for the Keeping of  
our own peace for the better rule and Government of the same Town  
and of our People there dwelling and of others there resorting and  
that the Town aforesaid for ever hereafter may be and remain a  
Town of Peace and Quiet for the punishment of Delinquents and for  
the reward of well doers And also that our peace and other Acts of  
Justice and good Government there may be better preserved and  
that if our Grant they shall enjoy more ample Honour priviledges  
and Libertys that then they will themselves obliged more

zealously to exert themselves in our Service of our Special Grace  
certain Knowledge and mere Motion We have willed, ordained  
constituted and granted and by these presents for us our heirs &  
Successors **Do** will ordain constitute and grant That our said Town  
of Conbridge in our said County of Glamorgan may and shall be and  
remain for ever hereafter a free Town of itself and that the Bailiffs  
Aldermen and Burgesses of the Town aforesaid and their Successors shall  
and may at all future times by virtue of these presents one Body  
Corporate and Politick in deed and in name by the names of the  
Bailiffs Aldermen and Burgesses of the Town of Conbridge in the  
County of Glamorgan into one Body corporate and politick in thing  
deed and name really and fully for us our heirs and Successors  
We do erect make ordain constitute create confirm ratify and  
declare by these presents and that by the same name they may  
have perpetual Succession and that they by the name of Bailiffs  
Aldermen and Burgesses of the Town of Conbridge in the County of  
Glamorgan shall and may be at all future times persons able and  
capable in the Law to have acquire receive and possess Manors  
messuages Lands Tenements Liberties privileges Jurisdictions Franchises  
and other hereditaments whatsoever of whatsoever Kind nature or  
Species they may be to them and their Successors in Fee and  
perpetuity or for term of Life Lives or years or in any other manner  
And also to give grant demise lett and assign the same manors  
messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments and to do and  
perform all and singular other things and Deeds whatsoever by the  
name aforesaid And that by the same name of Bailiffs  
Aldermen and Burgesses of the Town of Conbridge in the County of  
Glamorgan they may plead and be impleaded answer and be  
answered defend and be defended in whatsoever Courts and Places  
and before whatsoever Judges and Justices and other Officers and  
Ministers of us our heirs and Successors in all and singular  
Actions pleas Suits Complaints Matters and demands whatsoever  
of whatsoever Kind name Nature or Species they may be in the  
same manner and Form as other our Leige people within our

of the same Town AND that likewise there shall and may be  
within the Town aforesaid Twelve of the Burgesses of the Town  
aforesaid in form hereafter in these presents mentioned to be  
chose who shall be and shall be named Capital Burgesses of  
the Town aforesaid which Bailiffs Aldermen and Capital  
Burgesses of the Town aforesaid for the time being shall be of  
the Common Council of the said Town AND we will and by  
these presents for us our heirs and Successors grant to the  
aforesaid Bailiffs Aldermen and Burgesses of the aforesaid Town  
and their Successors that the Aldermen and Capital Burgesses

the time being are to be two) as often as such Laws Institutions  
Rights Ordinances Constitutions they shall make ordain or  
establish in form aforesaid such and such like punishments  
and Penalties by Imprisonments of their Bodys or by fines and  
Amerciements or by either of them upon all Delinquents against  
such Laws Rights Ordinances and constitutions or by any or either  
of them which to the same Bailiffs Aldermen and Capital  
Burgesses of the <sup>Town</sup> aforesaid for the time being or the major part of  
them (of whom the Bailiffs of the said Town for the time being  
are to be two) necessarily fit and requisite for the observance of the  
same Laws Ordinances and constitutions shall seem most  
expedient to order limit and provide and the same Fines and  
Amerciements shall and may levy and have to the use of the

other reasonable cause they or either of them shall be removed  
which Aldermen for the Town aforesaid for the time being and each  
of them from time to time for ill Government or misbehaviour or for  
any other reasonable cause we will shall be removable AND  
moreover we will and by these presents for us our heirs and  
<sup>Bailiffs Aldermen and Burgesses of the Town aforesaid,</sup>  
Successors do grant to the aforesaid and their Successors that  
whenever it shall happen either or any of the Aldermen of the  
Town aforesaid to dye or for reasonable cause be removed from  
their Offices that then and so often it shall and may be lawful for  
the remaining Aldermen of the Town aforesaid who at that time  
shall be living or remaining or the Major part of them one other  
or more Burgesses of the Town aforesaid in convenient time after the  
Death or removal of any such Alderman or Aldermen so happening  
to die or be removed to elect and nominate in the place or places  
of such Alderman or Aldermen so happening to dye or be removed  
and that he or they so as aforesaid to be hereafter elected and  
Chosen into the Office of Alderman or Aldermen of the Town aforesaid  
before that they or either of them is or are admitted to execute  
their Office by the Constable of the Castle of Stanblisham or by  
his deputy or deputys shall be approved and shall take their  
corporal Oath before the Constable of the Castle aforesaid or his  
Deputy well and faithfully to execute their Office and that after  
such approbation and Oath they and each of them shall and may  
have and execute the same Office during their natural Lives  
unless in the mean time for ill Government or misbehaviour or

Constable of the Castle of Lambethian aforesaid for the time being  
and the Bailiffs of the same Town and each of them for the  
Time being for the future shall and may be Justices of us or  
heirs and Successors for the Keeping of the peace of us our heirs  
and Successors within the Town aforesaid Liberties and precincts of  
the same as also the Statutes of Artificers and Labourers weights  
and measures within the Town aforesaid Liberties and precincts of  
the same to preserve correct and keep cause to be corrected and  
Kept And that the said Constable of the Castle aforesaid and  
Bailiffs of the Town aforesaid for the time being or any two of  
them wherof the Constable of the aforesaid Castle the wid we  
shall be one shall have full power and Authority to enquire  
of whatsoever delays Defects and Articles within the Town aforesaid  
Liberties and precincts of the same done moved or acted or  
hereafter to be done moved or acted which to the Keeper and  
Justice of peace in any <sup>County</sup> ~~County~~ of our Kingdom of England  
by the Laws and Statutes of the same Kingdom as Justices of

we will and by these presents for us our heirs and Successors  
grant to the aforesaid Bailiffs Aldermen and Burgesses of the  
Town aforesaid and their Successors that they and their Successors  
for ever hereafter shall and may have hold and keep within  
the Town aforesaid liberties and precincts of the same one Court  
of Record on every Thursday in every third week thro' the  
year for ever before the Bailiffs of the Town aforesaid for the  
time being to be holden and in the same Court they shall

within the Town aforesaid Liberties or precincts of the same arising

Suits pleas complaints and Actions shall not exceed the Value of five  
Pounds in Debt or damages and there from Times to Time shall  
be heard and determined before the Bailiffs of the Town aforesaid  
for the Time being by such and such sort of process, and ways  
as shall be consonant with the Laws and in as ample Manner and  
Form as in any other Court of Record within this our Kingdom  
of England is accustomed or can or ought to be done And  
further we will and by these presents for us our heirs and  
Successors grant to the aforesaid Bailiffs Aldermen and Burgeses  
of the Town aforesaid and their Successors all and all manner  
of Customs priviledges Franchises Liberties Authorities Exemptions
