
By 1822, Thomas was also dealing in tea (12). Towards the end of his life it seems that his son Nathaniel I had joined him in the business and that they were also selling ale and porter (13). However when Thomas died in 1832, his daughter took over his duties. She later married Thomas Lister who is recorded as the first chemist in Cowbridge (11)*. John became a surgeon.


