Last Will of Nathaniel Young of the town of Cowbridge, saddler.

5 Freehold messuages or dwelling houses situate in Church St. in Cowbridge and also leasehold interest in a dwelling house called the Old Workhouse in Church St, a certain range of freehold cottages, a Nailer's shop and other hereditaments which I have agreed to purchase of the Guardians of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union, 2 customary or copy-hold cottages situate at Penylan near Newton, Llanblethian parish and other real estate to nephew **Nathaniel Llewellyn**. To sister **Anne Llewellyn**, widow, an annuity of £10. All household furniture, stock in trade to Nathaniel Llewellyn, nominated Executor
Signed 29th May 1838 Died 8th March 1842 Probate 17th May 1842.

Inventory appraised £109.7s 4d. by John Aubrey, auctioneer.

With money out at interest: £250 Book debts : £339.9s5d. Total £698 16s.9d..

Also, he is described as 'unemployed' (8).

2.4. The Llewellyn family

[Thomas Llewellyn (1766-1832) was both a maltster and Clerk to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue (11).

He was married to Anne [-1852]. They had ten children.

By 1822, Thomas was also dealing in tea (12). Towards the end of his life it seems that his son Nathaniel I had joined him in the business and that they were also selling ale and porter (13). However when Thomas died in 1832, his daughter took over his duties. She later married Thomas Lister who is recorded as the first chemist in Cowbridge (11)*. John became a surgeon.

Nathaniel I first became a Road Surveyor and then changed to become a Saddler by trade. In 1852, he was also Clerk to the Commissioner of Taxes (as his father had been).

Nathaniel I's wife was called Jane I. She was born in 1814 in Flemingstone in Glamorgan.

The Llewellyns had thirteen recorded children born in the following years:

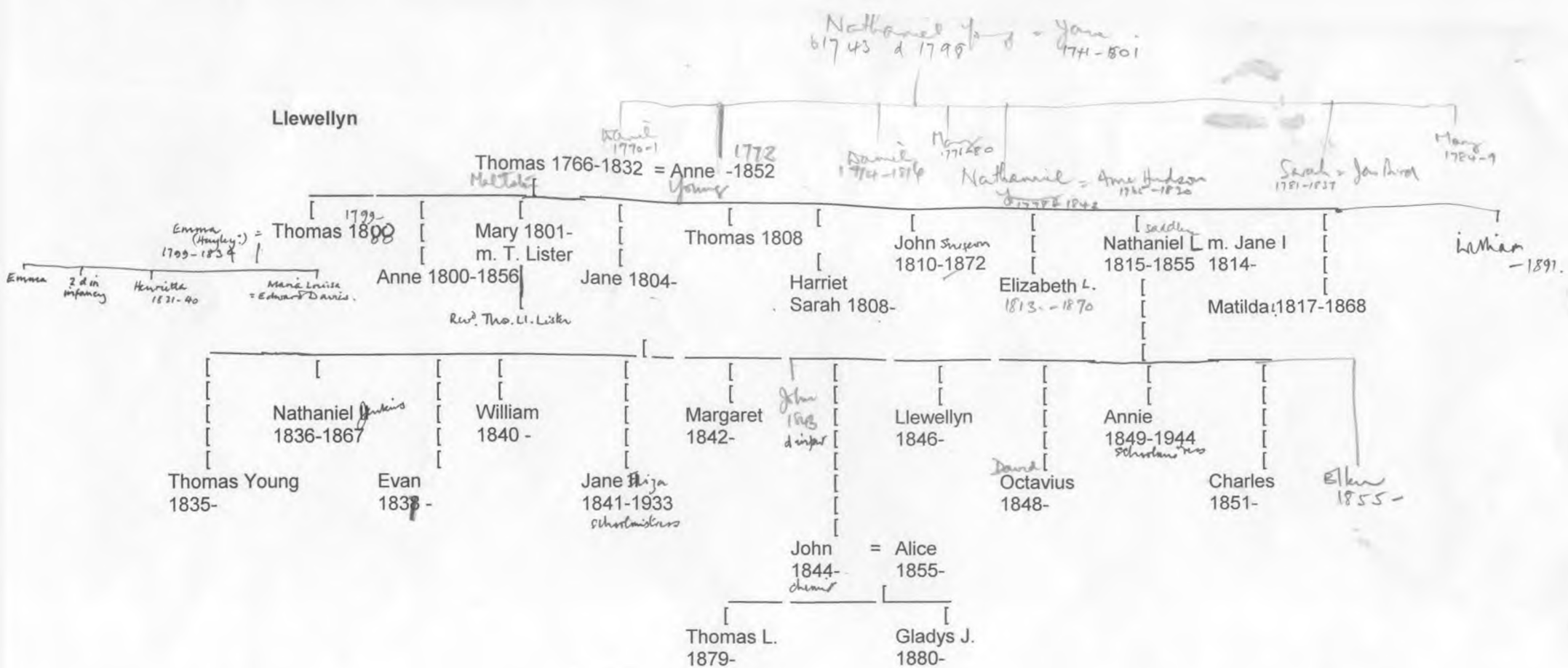
