Lister and the two daughters of my late brother Thomas and the three daughters of my late brother Nathaniel in equal shares each to take one sixth share I declare that the unpaid purchase money for the land taken by the Aberthaw Railway shall form part of my personal estate and shall be distributed as such I revoke all former wills made by me and I hereby appoint the said Thomas L. Lister Executor hereof As witness my hand this eighteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety William X Llewellyn

Whereas John Lovell then residing at Bangalore in
the Madras Presidency in the Empire of India a Major
in Her Majesty's 2nd Regiment of Hussars by Eliza
Lovell his Attorney on the 3rd day of April 1891 in
consideration of £1000 per annum to him paid by William
Hudlynn of Cowbridge in the County of Glamorgan
 Clerk in Holy Orders did out of Court surrender into the
hands of the Lord of the said Manor by the hands of
his Steward by the Rod according to the custom of the
said Manor All those three closes of customary held lands
(formerly two closes) adjoining each other but intersected by
the Cowbridge Railway containing by recent admeasurement
1. 2. 35, 2. 1. 12 and 4. 0. 16 and Rod 1145, 1449 and 1476
respectively on the Ordnance Map of the parish of
Llanblethian in the said County of Glamorgan and then
in the occupation of David Thomas and having lands of
Colonel Thompson the Reverend William Jenkins Williams
and the Cowbridge Railway Company in all or
most parts and sides thereof Together with all rights of
way appurtenant thereto All which said closes are situated
near Aberthaw in the said parish of Llanblethian and within
and parcel of the said Manor To the intent that the Lord of
the said Manor by the hands of his Steward by the

 Stewellyn paid to the Lord a fine and was admitted
 Tenant therefrom accordingly AND WHEREAS the said
 William Stewellyn by his Will bearing date the 18th
 day of December 1890 gave devised and bequeathed the
 whole of his real estate of whatsoever nature and wheresoever
 situated unto his Nephew Thomas Stewellyn Lister of
 Newport absolutely whom he also appointed sole Executor
 thereof AND WHEREAS the said William Stewellyn
 died on the 19th day of February 1891 and his said
 Will (with a Codicil thereto which does not affect the
 devise of real estate) was duly proved in the Principal
 Registry of the Probate Division of Her Majesty's High Court
 of Justice on the 17th day of April 1891 Now be it
 remembered that at the time and to the place
 aforesaid came the said Thomas Stewellyn Lister
 then residing at St Marks Vicarage Newport in
 the County of Monmouth Clerk in Holy Orders
 before the said Steward and prayed to be admitted
 Tenant of and to All and singular the said
 closes of land hereinbefore described to which said
 Thomas Stewellyn Lister the Lord of the said Manor
 by the hands of his Steward by the Rod
 according to the custom of the said Manor

granted seignior thereof To hold the same unto and to
the use of the said Thomas Stewellyn Lister and
his customary heirs and assigns for ever according to
the custom of the said Manor at and under the
rents customs herots duties suits and services whereof
due and of right accustomed and the said Thomas
Stewellyn Lister was duly admitted Tenant thereof
and paid to the Lord for a fine on his admittance
the sum of one shilling and four pence and his
fealty was respected.
