I remember that you told me you were going to be away - so you may not see this letter until you return.

There is quite a bit of information on the Sweetings in the Llanblethian parish register and there are numerous wills in the National Library, which would probably enable us to take the family tree back well into the 17th century. The earliest will of a Sweeting is for Elinor, of Llanblethian in 1634. There is a marriage of Elizabeth Sweeting at Llandough in 1615.

On the other page there is a possible family tree for Daniel Niblet Sweeting. (It needs a lot more proof.) A will of David Sweeting of Aberthin, yeoman, 1767, may be that of his father.
