She had five children, the youngest a daughter who died aged two. She, unfortunately, died the same year, 1918, and with her husband away in the army, her four

sons were all put into care.

According to the 1891 census, she had the following relatives living and working in Llanblethian - Thomas Thomas (b 1850), her father, a dairy farmer of New House, Broadway; Isaac Thomas (b 1860), uncle, carpenter, New House, Broadway; Hopkin Thomas (b 1862), uncle, saddler, East Village, Cowbridge; John Thomas (b 1864), uncle, baker and flour dealer, Llanblethian.
