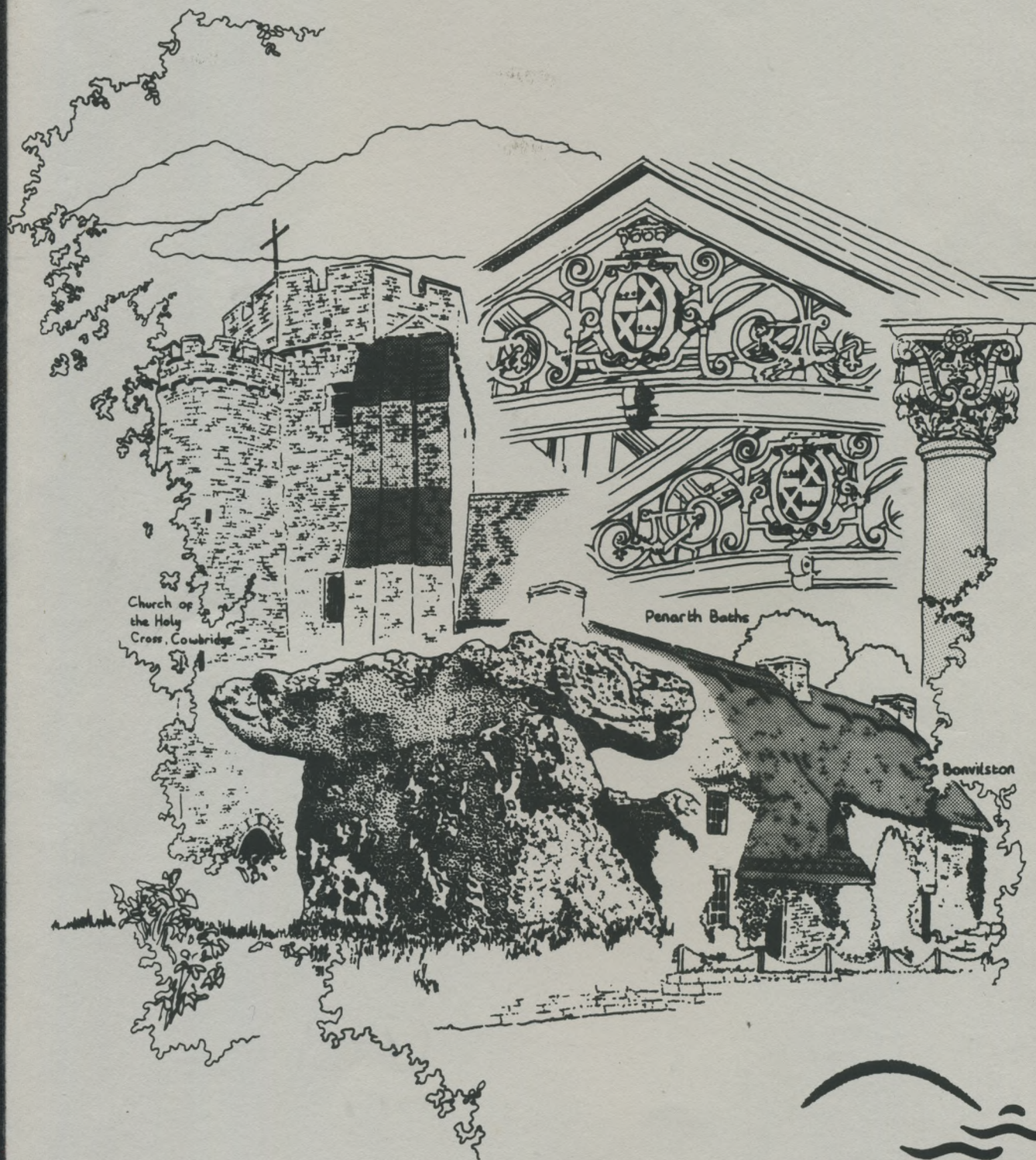


Listed Buildings in the Vale of Glamorgan

Introduction

The Vale of Glamorgan is an area rich in architectural heritage. This is represented by the fact that there are currently over 300 listed buildings, structures and artefacts within the Borough. However, although 'listed building' is a familiar term, the implications of listing are rarely fully understood.

Who designates Listed Buildings?

In Wales, the responsibility for designating buildings worthy of protection lies with the Secretary of State for Wales and Cadw, Welsh Historic Monuments.

How does a building become listed?

Buildings selected fall into one of four categories. These are:

- i) All buildings built before 1700 which survive in anything like their original condition.
- ii) Most buildings built between 1700 to 1840, although selection is necessary.
- iii) Buildings built between 1840 to 1914 that are of definite quality and character.
- iv) selected buildings of high quality built between 1914 to 1939.

Once selected, these buildings are included on the 'statutory list' maintained by Cadw as an Agency of the Secretary of State for Wales. There are also locally listed buildings and a County Treasures Survey, which identify buildings and artefacts of local significance.

The stock of listed buildings is not static, but is constantly being revised and added to as previously unrecorded buildings of merit are discovered. Within the rural vale, many buildings are of 16th century origins and merit protection. Therefore, if you are altering an unlisted building you may well expose significant artefacts or evidence of earlier construction.

Buildings are included in the 'statutory list' for good reason. They often have irreplaceable features, form part of an important group of buildings or are linked to the historical development of the area.

Listed buildings form the basis of our

architectural heritage and therefore warrant the strongest possible protection. Both the community and the Council have an obligation to preserve important buildings for the amenity and education of future generations.

How are Listed Buildings classified?

Listed buildings are classified into 3 groups:

Grade I - Buildings of exceptional interest, eg. St. Augustines Parish Church, Penarth. Only 3% of listed buildings in the Vale of Glamorgan fall into this category.

Grade II* - Buildings which do not fall into the above category, but which are more worthy of protection than the average building of special architectural or historic interest, eg. the Old Town Hall at Llantwit Major. This category accounts for 7% of the Vale's listed buildings.

Grade II - Buildings of special architectural or historic interest, eg. the former Customs House and Mercantile Marine Office, Barry. The remaining 90% of listed buildings are in the Grade II category.

What is Listed Building Consent?

Any works which materially affect the character of a listed building, both internal and external, will require listed building consent (many people have been wrongly lead to believe that the interior of a grade II building is exempt, for example). Consequently, many alterations (e.g. new windows, wholesale re-pointing, re-roofing) not normally the subject of planning permission could also require listed building consent.

Often, both planning permission and listed building consent will be required for a proposal. In such cases, separate applications are necessary which may not



be decided upon at the same time. This is because the Council does not have its own powers to fully decide upon listed building applications. Ultimate approval is only made after referral to the Secretary of State for Wales, through his agent Cadw, Welsh Historic Monuments.

The listing of a building may extend protection to an object or structure fixed to it, or which is within 'the curtilage' or immediate environment of the building. In any event, you are advised to seek the Council's opinion if there is doubt as to the necessity of making an application.

What else must I do if I own a Listed Building?

If you own a listed building it is your responsibility to ensure that the building is kept in reasonable repair. Failure to do so may result in a Repairs Notice being served by the local authority specifying the work needed to restore the building to a reasonable condition.

Emergency control

The local planning authority have special powers to protect buildings which are not listed. A Building Preservation Notice may be served which affords the same protection as listing a building. This then allows a maximum of six months for Cadw to decide if the building is worthy of inclusion on the 'statutory list'.

What grant aid is available?

Maintaining a listed building in a reasonable condition can incur considerable expense. This is largely due to the need to use traditional materials and techniques and to employ a high standard of craftsmanship. As a result a number of discretionary grants are available from the Vale of Glamorgan Borough Council and other public bodies. These grants will only provide assistance for work which is more than everyday maintenance, for example, re-roofing, or restoration of an exterior stone window surround. Painting or installing a new kitchen would not constitute eligible repairs.

i) **The Vale of Glamorgan Historic Buildings Fund:**

discretionary local authority grants are available for works to buildings of architectural and historical value and for buildings within conservation areas.

ii) **South Glamorgan County Council Historic Buildings Fund:** similar to the above but administered by the County Council.

iii) **Cadw, Welsh Historic Monuments:** discretionary grants are available for eligible repairs with an emphasis on Grade I and II* buildings. However

Grade II buildings can also be eligible for grant aid, depending on circumstances.

In addition, grants are also available for buildings whose improvement would make "a significant contribution towards the preservation or enhancement of the character or appearance" of a conservation area. As such, any buildings listed or unlisted lying within the boundaries of a conservation area may be eligible for financial assistance.

Design guidance

Before submitting an application for Listed Building Consent there are basic design principles that should be given full consideration. Always discuss the design / technical aspects of the alterations you propose prior to submitting for consent.

- i) The architectural details of a building are evidence of the period or, as in the case of many farmhouses, several periods of development. Where possible details should be retained or where necessary replicated.
- ii) The use of traditional materials to match the existing is essential in retaining the character of a building.
- iii) Removing structural features such as chimney stacks should be avoided.
- iv) The addition of inappropriate architectural features such as dormer windows should also be avoided.
- v) Retaining window and door openings as existing is important to maintain the traditional appearance of a building.

Emphasis should be placed on sensitive restoration and alteration, based upon traditional materials and construction techniques. Always employ a competent architect, surveyor and contractors who have proven relevant expertise and experience in the specialist work to be undertaken.

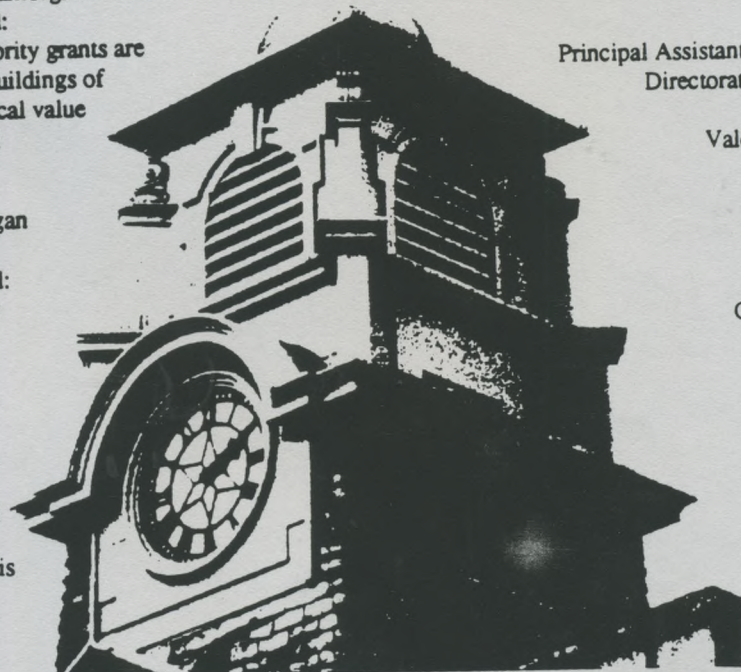

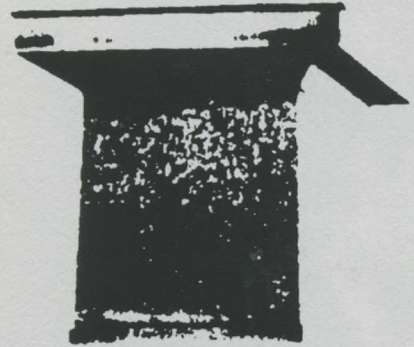
