Old school's stained glass windows saved

THREE BEAUTIFUL STAINED glass windows have been saved from vandalism and will now serve as a lasting memorial to the old Cowbridge Grammar School.

The windows have been part of the old school building since it was founded in 1608. But four years ago the school went comprehensive and moved to another building, leaving the old one derelict.

The Cowbridge Grammar School Old Boys' Associa-tion became worried that the windows would be vandalised.

The chairman, Mr. Ralph Bird, said they decided to remove the windows from the school and put them into Holy Cross Church next dcor.

And on Sunday, July 29, there will be a service at Holy Cross Church at which the windows and a special plaque [will] be officially installed.

Bird said: "There been an historic Mr. Bird said: "There has been an historic partnership between the school and the church and we decided to embark on the ambitious project of moving the windows from the school to the church.

The windows depict the founders of the school and are probably priceless.
