 (the Red Lion – which stood on the corner of Aberthin Rd, approximately on the site of the bar of today's Edmondes Arms. The name of the inn appears in one of David Jones of Wallington's sketches of Eastgate, but never seems to have been very significant. It was owned, like the adjoining property The Edmondes Arms, by the Revd. Thomas Edmondes of Old Hall, Cowbridge, and operated until 1880)

( Crown and Anchor) Freehold double licensed hotel fronting the Cardiff road at Eastgate, let to Mr John Davies at £18 p a, and the piece of ground adjoining let to Mr Evans at one shilling per week. Sold £320 to Dr Sheen.
