Minutes of the North American Festival of Wales committee meeting, Richmond Inn, Richmond, B.C. November 16, 2002

Present: Alan Upshall (Chair), Lynne Owens-Whalen (Vice-chair), Ellis Jones WNGGA, Don Murray, Phil Humphries, Neville Thomas, Gerri Baker Parry, Brian Parry, Helen Steinle, David Lintern, Ellen Webber, Gaynor Evans.

Alan officially welcomed Ellis Jones, Executive Director of the WNGGA and EllenWebber, who will be assisting Helen Steinle with the budget profile. Ellen has put together a spread sheet projecting income and expenditures for all Festival activities and sponsorships as put together by Alan and Don.

Alan advised that we are on track with regard to date deadlines.

Don reminded everyone that the deadline for <u>all</u> information to go into the brochure, is December $\sqrt{16,2002}$.

Review of the minutes of the last meeting.

Correction: Total budget for Publicity is \$30,000

<u>Rugby</u>: There has been no response from Dunvant Rugby Club. There is another proposal from Gareth Rees, Vancouver, to bring a team over from Ontario to play a B.C. Welsh side. Topic is under discussion.

Proposed meeting dates: Dec. 7 and Jan. 11 are favorable with the committee.

Tour Costs:

Lynne circulated a sheet with projected costs of individual tours.

Thursday, August 28, 2003: Skyscrapers and Tall Trees ?9.00am to 2.00pm.

It was agreed to charge \$95.00 each person (includes GST and entry to Capilano Canyon) for this tour. No lunch provided. Lynne will check with Gray Line whether drivers are allowed to assist disabled people on and off the bus. If not, then volunteers would be needed.

Ellis advised that some visitors to the Festival will start arriving on Tuesday and Wednesday but the majority arrive early Thursday afternoon.

Downtown Opening Ceremony: Thursday, August 28, 2003. 3.00pm to 4.30pm

Don has been in touch with Vancouver City, The Art Gallery and CBC. If an outdoor ceremony is not feasible due to costs, then we might be able to use CBC Plaza, preferably with limited costs to us.

It was agreed that we continue with plans to hold this event in downtown Vancouver. The Welsh Tourist Board and WNA Chamber of Commerce will be in town for the Festival and might be interested to help organize. Don will also need someone to help him set up this event. The Vancouver Welsh Men's Choir has agreed to take part in the opening ceremony. Question as to whether we should give the VWMC an honorarium? We could consider giving them a discount on a block of tickets for the Grand Concert.

Thursday, August 28: Market Place will open at 9.00am to 5.00pm

Thursday, August 28: Registration desk will be open from 9.00am to 6.00pm

Thursday, August 28: Salmon Barbecue Reception: 4.00pm to 6.00pm

The Richmond Inn has suggested we use the courtyard for the Salmon BBQ and the Garden Room can also be used for overflow or if weather dictates.

It was agreed that the cost per person be \$35 Can. (includes GST and gratuities).

Lynne will check with the hotel whether there will be a reduced cost for children under 13 years.

Thursday, August 28, 2003: Opening Ceremony at the Richmond Inn. 7.00pm prompt.

Ysgol Gerdd Ceredigion will follow with a concert at 7.30pm to 9.00pm

Ticket cost: \$25 Can. (includes GST)

Dylan Thomas Hour, (readings from his poems etc.) 9.30pm - 10.30pm

Ticket cost: \$10 Can. (includes GST). Cabaret style seating.

These two events will have separate venues. We will offer the Dylan Thomas group an honorarium of \$500 max. to be negotiated down if possible. Neville will liaise with Geoffrey Madoc-Jones.

Informal Singing: 10.30pm onwards..... We will need an accompanist and director. Alan will contact Tom Gething to help with this event.

Alan advised that the Rag foundation folk group from Wales are unlikely to attend the Festival as expenses are too high (approx. \$29.000) and so far the British Council has offered only 1,000 pounds in sponsorship. If the group organizes a tour themselves and we offer a spot in the Festival, then approx. cost to us would be around \$7,000.

Two other folk groups have been recommended to Alan; Mabon (Wales), probably same costs as Rag Foundation and a group from Washington DC, Moch Pryderi. To be considered.

Room Allocation:

Registration and Market Place must be set up in secure locations. Westminster Salons 1 and 2 are lockable rooms and can be converted into one large room to accommodate the two if necessary.

Three stations will be needed for registration; one for pre-registration pick-up, one for on site registration and one work table for filling out forms. The banquet ticket exchange (registrants are given a banquet ticket and then exchange it at the station for a white ticket with their table number) can be located in the foyer outside the Westminster Salons.

We should try to avoid using Westminster Salon 3 for seminars unless absolutely necessary. The Garden Room is most central and will be ideal for the Tea Room and for general socializing. This is also a secure room. Recommend to Brian that the Garden Room becomes the Tea Room and that Westminster 1 and 2 become Market Place/ Registration.

Eisteddfod

This event will take place in the Ballroom of the Hilton Hotel, Richmond.

Phil circulate an information sheet with list of events; time and day they will perform and approx. time needed for each event and adjudication.

Question as to whether it is feasible to hold the adult choir competition? It was agreed that we should offer this category and see how many entrants we get.

The entrance fees for competitors was discussed and agreed upon.

Youth Choir - free Cash prize for winner: \$75.00
Youth Solo - free. Cash prize for winner: \$150.00
Adult Choir - \$50.00 Cash prize for winner: \$150.00
Regular solo - \$15.00 Cash prize for winner: \$75.00
Story Telling -\$15.00 Cash prize for winner \$75.00

Semi-professional - \$30.00 The prize for the winner of this category is one week in

Wales plus the entry fee to compete in the Eisteddfod, sponsored by David Morris. The winner will also receive the David G. Morris Trophy.

We have five trophies on hand and need one more. These will be presented to the winners but must be returned for future Eisteddfodau. All entrants will receive a certificate acknowledging their participation.

Phil displayed an engraved glass trophy that he thought would be suitable to present to winners of the Eisteddfod for them to keep. Phil to put together wording for each trophy and Peggy Heath will be asked to do layout with logo.

It was agreed to advertise the Eisteddfod as three sessions. Fri. am.; Fri. pm.. and Sat. am. Should we have a pass for both days or individual tickets for each session? It was agreed that we have a ticket for each session and charge \$12.50 per session.

All entrance fees to the Eisteddfod from competitors are to go directly to Phil. We will make up the entry form and they will be mailed out with registration forms by HQ.

An accompanist will be needed for this event and there will likely be a fee involved. Alan will take a proposal to the next WNGGA meeting that they donate a trophy to the Eisteddfod.

Gourmet Lunch: 10.30am to 4.30pm

John Bishop has offered to take a maximum of 30 people for lunch at an organic farm in Abbotsford, where he will cook a gourmet meal. <u>Church Service:</u> 10.00am at the Richmond Inn. The minister will be Rev. Ronald Rees, Liverpool. David is liaising with Rev. Rees to organize the order of service. Bron and Kath Journey will perform special music.

Sunday August 31.

Gymanfa Ganu: Session 1: 2.00pm to 4.30pm

Venue: ? Richmond Senior Secondary School, which is in the process of being built at this time. We will probably need a shuttle bus for any disabled visitors.

Haydn James (Wales) will direct and will select the hymns. The accompanist has not yet been decided on. The winner(s) of the Eisteddfod will also perform at this time.

Non registrants will be charged \$5.00 Can. for each session they attend.

There will be an inter-sessional meal at a cost of \$25.00 Can. per person. It will be decided later whether we offer a boxed lunch or a deli sandwich buffet.

Haydn James will direct and special music will be performed by Ysgol Gerdd Ceredigion. This will be followed by the Closing Ceremonies.
