Dear All

I heard today from the Wales Tourist Board and they have agreed to continue with their 5000 pound sponsorship specifically to support Gwyn Hughes Jones. Here is their reply and the specificity for Gwyn was discussed on the telephone. I have written to Heledd Williams to confirm this.

The WTB will be glad to fund again this year, as last year, and agree to the £5k funding especially on today's rate of exchange ! Again, we will want to avail ourselves to the full package as presented to us last year. However, we cannot raise a Purchase Order for this until the new financial year in April of 2004. I hope this doesn't prove to be a problem your end.

I hope that all the planning is going well for the team this year.

In my letter to them, the relevant part of which is copied below I indicated the terms for the sponsorship and Heledd indicates that the WTB wants to be availed of all of this. So it is very important for the future support of WTB that we make sure they get the maximum recognition in all the publicity and literature. Any time Gwyn is mentioned it should be accompanied by 'Sponsored by the Wales Tourist Board'.

If you could circulate to the relevant people Myfanwy please and ensure that the terms are well known that would be a great help.

With today's' exchange it comes to \$9133.35, that should help.
