At the planning meeting in Orlando, there was some interest expressed in the possibility of our hosting a Welsh film festival at NAFOW 2005. In the past, Mark Woods, an American graduate student in film studies at Glamorgan University, has discussed with me the idea of holding such an event and I have suggested he consider NAFOW as a possible venue. In a recent correspondence, I asked him to send a proposal to the Orlando committee which would outline the nature of the project for the planning committee's consideration. When it is available, I will send this proposal on to you (or the appropriate subcommittee) so that it can be discussed and action taken. For now, I thought you might be interested in reading our correspondence. He mentions Steven Blandford who is a scholar of Welsh film and head of the Department of Arts and Media at Glamorgan and Dai Smith, who is an eminent historian, television producer/presenter, former head of BBC Wales and the current Pro-Vice Chancellor of Glamorgan University.
