



The 3M Male Chorus, originally organized in 1947, has been a recreational activity open to 3M Company employees and their close family relatives for over thirty years. Membership numbers about 50, and two of the original charter members are still singing regularly with the group.

In 1977 the Chorus toured Europe, giving concerts at a number of locations where the 3M Company has plants. The opening concert was at Gorseinon, near Swansea, Wales, where extremely cordial relations were established with a number of Welsh singing organizations, including the Dunvant Male Choir. Other concerts were given in France and Germany.



Nansi Richards was born at Cwmgors, a village on the border between the old counties of Glamorgan and Carmarthen. She began her musical career at a very early age. She has proven to be a successful competitor by winning the first prize at the Royal National Eisteddfod of Wales on three occasions. She also won a Glamorgan County Scholarship which enabled her to study at the University College of Wales at Aberystwyth. She is one of Wales' most popular sopranos and has been in constant demand for concerts and oratorio performances in London and the provinces. She has also performed in Germany and France. This is her fifth visit to the United States since 1973. Recently she released a new L.P. record which promises to be a great success.
