MINUTES OF JUNE 2nd MEETING - BUFFALO ROOM, STATLER HILTON HOTEL

The meeting was brought to order at 2:35 pm and opened with a prayer delivered by Mr. D. Edwards.

Official greeting from the National Committee were delivered by Mr. Edwards and Mr. Meadows.

Minutes of the May meeting were read and approved.

It was decided to conduct the meeting according to the same topics of discussion as had been covered at the May meeting. They were as follows:

Religious Activities:

Rev. C. Davis will be conducting a bilingual service at both of the Sunday sessions. As of yet, not soloist has been choosen.

It was also decided that a list of possible hymns would be drawn up and submitted to the minister for a final decission on what was to be sung.

Music: An organ will be rented from Poppenberg's for a total cost of \$\$62.00, which includes \$30.00 trucking costs. Elizabeth Keith will sing at the Gymanfu, her services amounting to \$50.00 and accomodations.

The Youngstown Sheet & Tube Metal Choir will be here on a one day basis only. (Jack Meadows is to be sent a set of directions for the choir as to route to the route to the hotel and Bennett Senior High School.)

Arrangements are to be made to have a room available for the choir to change in at the Hotel, also one meal is to be served them, preferably at the High School.)

It was agreed that the choir was to sing a total number of eight, approximately four per session.

A discussion was raised as to Anthems at the Gymanfu.

The Doxology is to be sung before the prayer in the service. The ushers will take up the collection but will not return for the blessing.

The afternoon session will start at 2 p.m., with the evening session at the usual time of 7:00 p.m. All verses of the anthem 'America' will be sung at the opening of the evening session.

(A p.s. will be added to the final mailed notice that

it would be advisable to brush up on the 'Hallaluah Chorus', just in case.)

Advertising: So far the committee has \$750.00 of committed advertising.

Nwry Plant: Nothing to report so far as most of it will take place at the Gymanfu itself.

Nosen Lowen: It was decided (Understood?) that people would be accepted as they come, a sort of Welsh Hootenanny.

Mr. Desgaspar, the caterer for the Bennett High School, had been invited to attend this meeting. He presented a run down for the dinner at the High School which went like this.

The cafateria is capable of serving 900 hundred people at a sitting, so three sittings should be enough. There will be five serving lines continuously at work. A 'Box Lunch' of Sandwiches, salad, dessert, and beverage can be provided at a cost of \$1.50 each. Tickets for this dinner will propably be sold at the registration desk in the hotel along with the bus tickets. Dinner will start at 5:00 and continue through 7:00 p.m.

No final decision was reached as to what the lunch would be, that will be left up to Mr. Desgaspar and the Committee to decided. He asked that an approximate figure, within 10%, be submitted to him no later then Saturday, August 31, and this was agreed to.

Also discussed at this time was the final arrangements for the banquet. The menu was read to the committees by Rachel Seeley, and a final price of \$6.00 per plate was agreed to.

Publicity for the months of July and August were discussed. Most of the advertising is to be done in the July issues of the 'Y Drych' and 'Yr Enfys'., preferably using the N. G. G. A. space.

Meeting was closed at 5:00p.m. with a prayer from Louis Edwards.
