### Eisteddfod '99

This marks the fourth year of the North American Eisteddfod. The aims of the competition are to encourage many people of diverse ages and abilities to participate in a proud and ancient Welsh tradition, and to offer to the community an opportunity to hear great music and poetry showcased through fine artistic talent. To this end, the North American Eisteddfod will be held in conjunction with the Sixty-eighth National Gymanfa Ganu, September 2-5, 1999, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Adjudicators for the competition will include Welsh baritone Jeremy Huw Williams and Welsh author, poet, and illustrator Tegwyn Jones.

The Minneapolis "Eisteddfod '99" will continue the vocal and instrumental categories initiated by the Bellevue North American Eisteddfod in 1994. New this year is a call for literary entries, both spoken and written. Also new this year are "amateur" and "artist" divisions for each category. Participants can choose whether they wish to compete as an artist or as an amateur. Adjudicators will choose winners in the artist divisions of each category. Amateur participants will have a chance to perform before the audience and adjudicator, and will receive comments, but will not be ranked competitively. The literary category is being presented as an exhibition event and consequently also will not rank its entrants. Literary entries may be selected for special distinction at the discretion of the adjudicator. All literary entries will be included in a commemorative booklet to be distributed at the eisteddfod. Youth entrants may choose either amateur or artist categories; all youth amateur entrants will be scheduled to perform on Saturday, September 4. Côr Cymry Gogledd America members competing in "artist" categories will be scheduled to perform their preliminary rounds on Thursday, September 2.

### Categories

- I. *Musical* All musicians will be expected to perform two pieces, one of which must be by a Welsh composer or include a tune of Welsh origin. Vocal entrants are encouraged but not obligated to sing in Welsh. Choral entries are welcome. Entrants seeking Welsh repertoire may find a variety of works listed on the web-site catalog of Welsh publisher CURIAD, http://www.curiad.co.uk.
- II. Literary Writers may submit a narrative ballad (in the rollicking "Come all ye good people" style) about any contemporary event or affair, a short story with a Welsh-American background, a collection of ten original limericks, a brief essay ("Mountains" or "Language"), a poem ("Dilemma"), or a ten-line humorous acrostic poem with the initial letter of each line in this order: C-A-E-R-N-A-R-F-O-N. Orators may declaim either Goronowy in America (Harri Webb) or Quite Early One Morning (Dylan Thomas) or an original entry in one of the afore-mentioned categories (original entries for declamation must be submitted in writing with the application). Entries may be submitted in Welsh or in English; orators desiring Welsh poetry for declamation should contact the Eisteddfod Committee at the address given on the application form.
